Employee at Tucherpark site in Munich tested positive on Coronavirus – specific measures are being taken to protect employees

Yesterday, 6 March 2020, HypoVereinsbank was advised that an employee who is based in a room on the ground floor of the VTW1 building in the Tucherpark site in Munich has tested positive for the Coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2). HypoVereinsbank is in ongoing contact with the affected employee who is under medical observation to ensure he/she gets all the support possible and wishes him/her a speedy recovery.

As a precautionary measure HypoVereinsbank immediately closed the affected room in the specific building. The relevant parts of the building have been deep-cleaned and disinfected and the affected room will remain closed until further notice.

Moreover, HypoVereinsbank has contacted all employees who may have been in close and recent contact with the individual, advising them to self-quarantine for 14 days and to follow the instructions of the health authorities.

HypoVereinsbank has already implemented the following precautionary measures in the last weeks:

- HypoVereinsbank has activated health and safety protocols and will continue to carefully monitor the situation in the affected regions
- HypoVereinsbank encourages employees to rely on agreed alternative work solutions, such as remote working from home
- Employees who were in / visited the affected areas in the last two weeks will need to work remotely if at all possible; if not possible, they will be put on paid leave and will not be allowed to access their habitual place of work
- On 22 February 2020 UniCredit put in place a Group-wide non-essential domestic and international travel ban. This was in addition to the previously implemented business travel ban to, from and within Asia and to, from and within the affected areas in Northern Italy.

For the time being, HypoVereinsbank will keep all the above mentioned measures in place.

All office buildings of HypoVereinsbank including the HVB Tower in Munich as well as the branches will remain open.
